

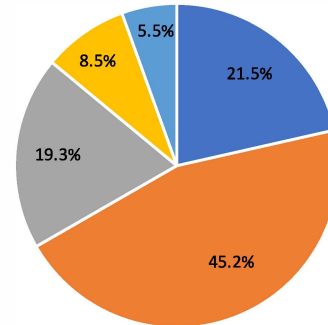
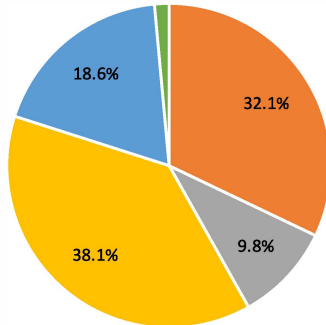
Bublr Bikes Annual Report 2020

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

FREE RIDE DAYS

Bublr had six free ride days providing **672** free rides including **480** free rides on the three Election Days in Milwaukee County.

ADAPTIVE BIKE PROGRAM

Bublr added a handcycle to the adaptive fleet and developed instructional signage for high use stations.

FREE 30-DAY PASSES

Bublr provided **1,827** Free 30-Day passes to Milwaukee County residents in June (thank you GMF) and September. Recipients took **4,916** trips!

ESSENTIAL WORKER DISCOUNT

Bublr provided **131**, \$5, 30-Day Passes to essential workers in months when they were not already free.

ACCESS PASS

Bublr provided **512** free and reduced cost Access Passes to income qualified individuals.

ESSENTIAL SERVICE

Bublr has stayed open as an essential service during the entire COVID-19 pandemic as a safe, social distanced way for people to get around, and get exercise.
